Rex (Michael Caton) is a cab driver from Broken Hill. On the surface he appears as a simple man whose days are spent driving miners to the airport, whose evenings are spent drinking a beer with a handful of old mates and whose mornings pass by as he has tea with his neighbour Polly (Ningali Lawford). But underneath the apparent simplicity of his daily life Rex is in poor health. Now, facing bad news he understands that he wants to control his final moments, meanwhile in Darwin Dr Farmer (Jacki Weaver) may have the perfect solution. Rex just needs to drive there.

A uniquely Australian road movie, director Jeremy Sims delivers what will undoubtedly become a classic, based on a script by Reg Cribb and Jeremy Sims - the film is the product of a Perth dream team whose resumes include 2006's Last Train To Freo.

Tightly directed, the well-paced script negotiates the potentially controversial material with ease and the cast - some of the country's best actors - offer powerful performances. Add a score by Ed Kuepper and it's clear that Last Cab To Darwin delivers on all levels.



For over two decades one of the most exciting national cinemas has been that of Iran. One of Rev's most popular events, IFFA returns with a program showcasing the strength and quality of films from this otherwise troubled country.

FISH AND CAT (MAHI VA GORBEH)

DIR: SHAHRAM MOKRI (2013/134MINS)

A number of students have travelled to the Caspian region in order to participate in a kite-flying event during the winter solstice. Next to their camp is a small hut occupied by three cooks who work at a nearby restaurant. The cooks are looking for some meat to cook and there is no one around other than the young students. The film is based on a true story about a restaurant that served minced human flesh for food. An innovative and technically impressive film, shot in a single take and a new way to approach time and space in storytelling.

KAMI'S PARTY (MEHMOUNIYE KAMI)

DIR: ALI AHMADZADE (2013/80MINS)

Kami's Party follows two very different car trips to a party that's being held cross-country. Nazanin has killed her sister Negin's boyfriend, Omid. Before she can dispose of the body, Negin takes the car she has hidden him in. Nazanin goes after her but Negin won't stop and wait. Negin unknowingly flirts with the danger of being discovered going through checkpoints and picking up hitchhiker, Armin. A true road movie with sinister undertones, and gives a look into the lives of rich young Iranians.

#### THE PATERNAL HOUSE (KHANÉH PEDARI)

DIR: KIANOUSH AYARI (2012/97MINS)

Nearly a century ago a young woman is killed by her own father, with the aid of her younger brother. How she has shamed the family is not made explicit, but the males all agree that to save their honour she must die. Her mother and sister do not know what to make of her disappearance. She is secretly buried in the cellar, a space where the women of the family weave carpets and do other domestic chores. But her loss, or perhaps her presence, continues to haunt the family, reverberating through the following generations. Although the film screened at Fajr and in Venice in 2012, only now has it received an official screening permit.

#### THE PAINTING POOL (HOWZE NAGHASHI)

DIR: MAZIAR MIRI (2013/94MINS)

Maryam and Reza work in the packaging department of a pharmaceutical company. They try to lead a regular life, but for them everything is a challenge – even crossing the street or cooking a pizza. Their young son, Soheil, becomes embarrassed by his mentally challenged parents and starts to spend more and more time with his teacher's son. When Reza loses his job, Soheil refuses to go home. His parents' world collapses.

This unusual issue is tackled with great sensitivity by director Maziar Miri, who extracts outstanding performances from leads, Shahab Hosseini and Negar Javaherian. A heartrending and remarkable film about a mentally challenged couple fighting for their right to be a family.

#### I'M NOT ANGRY! (ASABANI NISTAM)

DIR: REZA DORMISHIANI (2014/110MINS)

This stunning second film from writer-director Reza Dormishian (Hatred, IFFA 2012), is a love story set amidst the Green Movement, the wave of political protests round 2009.

Setareh (Baran Kosari) and Navid (Navid Mohammadzadeh), an Iranian Kurd, are both political activists who meet at university and participate in political rallies together. But the idealistic and romantic Navid cannot control his anger in the face of corruption and finds himself expelled. After four years of trying to establish himself financially for marriage, he is no closer.

The ending is both shocking and unexpected. But the film is not just their story – it shows with stark clarity the effect of the Ahmedinejad years on Iran. Award winning performances, great music and script, supported by good technical values make this controversial film unmissable.

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#### POLISH FILM FESTIVAL IN PERTH

The history of Polish film is almost as long as the history of cinematography itself. With a "new wave" of Polish talent blossoming right before our eyes, there is no better time to explore contemporary works of one of the most vital filmmaking nations of modern cinema. With Oscar and BAFTA awards in the Best Foreign Language Film category, a Silver Bear award in Berlin, a shower of other festival prizes and global recognition of film critics, Polish cinema is in full-scale renaissance.

BODY (CIAŁO)
DIR: MAŁGORZATA SZUMOWSKA (2015/90MINS)

Touching, light in tone and beautifully nuanced film from acclaimed director, Małgorzata Szumowska, about the inextricable link between mind and body, the grief after losing a loved one and different ways of dealing with it. An official selection at the 2015 Berlin International Film Festival Main Competition, *Body* won the Silver Bear for Best Director. A busy prosecutor is worried that his anorexic daughter Olga, who is grieving over her recently deceased mother, might try to harm herself. He forces her to see Anna, a quirky psychiatrist who is dealing with her own loss in an unusual way.

#### CARTE BLANCHE

DIR: JACEK LUSINSKI (2015/106MINS)

Inspired by real events, a story of a respected high school teacher who hides his progressing blindness from his friends, family, students and superiors. The medical diagnosis leaves little hope. Due to a genetic disorder Kacper is faced with a very real possibility of permanent blindness. Initially heartbroken, he decides to hide his health problems to fulfil his educational duty and help students with end of school exams.

#### WOMEN'S DAY (DZIEN KOBIET)

DIR: MARIA SADOWSKA (2012/90MIN)

Halina, a modest cashier in a budget supermarket, lives in a small town dreaming of a better life for herself and her gifted 13 year old daughter. Her boss, who shows an increasing interest in her, gives her an opportunity to work in a managerial position. She soon learns that the promotion comes at a price.

An emotional and heart-warming drama about exploitation, corporate greed and the inner struggle to find courage and strength to make a stand against it.

#### LIFE FEELS GOOD (CHCE SIE ZYC)

DIR: MACIEJ PIEPRZYCA (2013/107MIN)

History of Mateusz, a boy diagnosed at a very young age as mentally disabled with no ability to communicate. For nearly twenty-five years he's been deemed a vegetable by everyone but his parents, who believed in his ability to improve. Now thirty and institutionalized, he faces a committee of physicians who will decide his future. Will he prove to everyone that despite his physical handicap, he is in fact intelligent?

Winner of multiple awards, including first prize at the 37th International Film Festival in Montreal, *Life Feels Good* proved to be particularly popular with audiences enchanted by a beautifully told true story, outstanding performance by Dawid Ogrodnik and a positive message - never give up, face obstacles and enjoy life as it is.

WARSAW 44 (MIASTO 44)

DIR: JAN KOMASA (2014/130MIN)

A riveting film about youth, love and bravery of young Poles destined to enter adulthood in the cruel days of German occupation. Stefan, a loving son and brother who cares for his family after his father's death, is torn between the urge of joining anti-Nazi resistance and a promise he made to his mother that he will not engage with the underground. Faced with daily humiliation from German oppressors in a chocolate factory he works at, Stefan ultimately decides to break his promise and join the Warsaw Uprising.

One of the most expensive Polish film projects directed by the highly praised filmmaker Jan Komasa, with special effects by Richard Bain, the man behind the visual effects of *Casino Royale*, *Inception* and *King Kong. Warsaw 44* reflects the human side of a battle that led to the total destruction of Warsaw and relives the days of the largest and most tragic revolt undertaken by any European resistance movement against the Germans in occupied Europe. In two months of fighting about 17,000 insurgents and over 200,000 civilians were killed in the doomed uprising, intended by the Polish Home Army (AK) to liberate Warsaw from German occupation.



Peter Strickland's *The Duke of Burgundy* is a beautifully shot, visually evocative feature that recalls the stylistic excess of seventies' European directors such as Walerian Borowczyck and Jess Franco, with nods to Bunuel. Focusing on lesbian couple Evelyn and Cynthia, the film follows their relationship and its roots in sex games that explore rituals of submission and dominance, simultaneously it examines Cynthia's career as a lepidopterist and the couple's almost dreamlike existence in their lavish chateau.

Strickland - whose career has included works such as Berberian Sound Studio and Bjork: Bibliophilia Live – compliments the lavish visuals and evocative script that almost recalls Angela Carter's works, with a soundtrack by cult group Cat's Eyes, while actresses Sidse Babett Knudsen (familiar from cult TV series Borgen) and Chiara D'Anna are perfect in their roles as Cynthia and Evelyn. Executive produced by Ben - A Field In England - Wheatley.

It's 1866 and the Civil War is over. Former Confederate soldier Wade Riley returns to his family homestead in country Texas. But in the face of rural hardship a new darkness has settled on the family's farm, and a feud is rapidly brewing between the Rileys and their neighbours the McCluskeys, both of whom are wrapped in a sense of loss. What slowly unfolds is a tale of family, of loyalty, of violence and of revenge.

Reminiscent of the kind of contemplative style of westerns like *The Unforgiven, Echoes of War* is a brooding tale that draws on the human elements as the source of its narrative.

First time feature director, and multi-award winning short filmmaker, Kane Senes draws a brooding claustrophobia from the Texan landscapes, the two farms, and their land, emphasising the traps that both families have found themselves in.

With a cast that includes James Badge Dale (World War Z and The Departed), Ethan Embry (Once Upon A Time and Cheap Thrills), William Forsythe (The Devil's Rejects and Boardwalk Empire), Beth Broderick (Lost and Under the Dome), Maika Monroe (It Follows) and Rhys Wakefield (The Black Balloon and The Purge), Echoes of War is a well acted, character driven movie that breathes new life into the western.

Directors Rania Attieh and Daniel Garcia's H. tells the story of two women, both of whom are named Helen and who live in Troy, New York. Both are thinking about their children; the late-middle aged Helen's (Robin Bartlett) 'child' is a lifelike surrogate baby doll, while the younger Helen (Rebecca Dayan) is pregnant with her first child. Then, late one evening, something explodes in the sky over the city.

Following is a slipstream science fiction movie, defined by a mood that echoes both Under The Skin and The Fifth Season (both of which have played at Revelation).

There is an emphasis on the personal and low key at play in H. - small details and events weave together in the movie. The atmosphere becomes increasingly surreal as the film unfolds. There is a sense of reality unwinding, of dreams becoming more powerful, of reality slowly transforming.

Beautifully shot (by Garcia) the film maintains a dreamlike atmosphere throughout, poignant images punctuate the narrative while the sound design helps to weave the increasingly uncanny atmosphere into a whole.

Hollywood is a breath of fresh air in a film industry that is too often reliant on recognisable plots and characters. Nothing about this film is what you may be used to, or what you expect. What is essentially a three hander set in an apartment, a father - whose characterisation is somewhere between Hunter S. Thompson and a bad-ass Jack Nicholson - and son are brought together along with a hooker in what seems to be a last hurrah for the old man.

But as the movie develops it's clear that the old man is in some great degree of mobster related trouble and is hoping to enlist his script-writer son to extract him from an increasingly difficult position. In doing so they all experience the most unusual and very, very icky characters.

Hollywood is a flashy film in a secret way. While it looks great it's certainly the work of an artist in the true sense - and while it's certainly not for everybody, there's real cinematic discovery here. For an audience prepared to take the leap, there's great reward, both now and into the future in experiencing an early work of a director who's unique style is just waiting to be discovered.

An evocative coming of age/road movie that follows teenager Davina and her boyfriend Sterling as they hit the road, taking a trip through rural California. Davina is anxious to escape from the pressures of her life – that include looking after her handicapped mother - in fantasy and the idea of romance, but as the film develops it becomes clear that brooding Sterling has his own issues.

There is a sense that the film is truly personal, I Believe In Unicorn's focuses on Davina, on her relationships, her fantasies and dreams; creates an evocative movie that captures the complex moments between youth and adulthood exploring the raw vulnerability of its protagonists. First-time feature film writer/director Leah Meyerhoff draws powerful performances from her young cast, with IndieWire describing Natalia Dyer's turn as Davina as "complete dynamite," while Peter Vack turns in a brooding performance as Sterling.

Poet, novelist, journalist and filmmaker Pier Paolo Pasolini was brutally murdered in November 1975, at the height of his creative powers.

The director of films such as *The Gospel According to Matthew* (1964), *Theorem* (1968), *Decameron* (1971), *The Canterbury Tales* (1972), *Arabian Nights* and the legendary *Salol o le 120 gionate di Sodoma* (1975), a film he completed shortly before his death. Pasolini was a homosexual and one time supporter of the Communist Party and a controversial figure in his native Italv.

In *Pasolini* visionary director Abel Ferrara re-imagines the last days of the director's life.

Casting William Dafoe as Pasolini, Ferrara creates a powerful and affecting portrait of the director as he completes *Salo*, meets journalists and friends, and imagines his next (sadly unrealised) project. Dafoe turns in a superb performance as Pasolini, in a movie described by the Guardian as a "bewitching walk on the wild side."

Abel Ferrara – director of The Driller Killer (1979), Ms 45 (1981), King of New York (1990), Bad Lieutenant (1992), The Addiction (1995) and many others – creates an absorbing study of one of the few cinematic artists brave enough to explore all facets of humanity.



Telling the story of a small family who live in a lighthouse, the film follows Ben, his mute sister Saoirse and their father, Connor (voiced by Brendan Gleeson) as they learn to cope with the loss of their mother. It is a tale of magic, myth and family as Saoirse and Ben work together to find their way home and unlock the mysteries of the ancient stories that their mother has told them.

Traditionally animated, *Song of the Sea* is a beautifully realised, poetic work that will stay with audiences long after the credits have rolled. Nominated for an Academy Award in 2015 The Song of the Sea has wowed critics and audiences all around the world. It will enthral adults and children alike and is destined to become a classic due to its magical storytelling and visual splendor.

The film has been compared to Mamoru Hosoda's Wolf Children, but it is its own beast.

Spring is a rare, unique movie, playing across genres and forms as it follows Evan (Lou Taylor Pucci) as necessity forces him to leave his home in the USA and head to Europe. Here he meets the enigmatic student Louise (Nadia Hilker) in a small Italian town and the two soon start a relationship. But there's far more at play than simple romantic drama, and the film detours into territory more commonly explored in films such as Val Lewton's Cat People and perhaps even Ken Russell's Altered States.

With deceptively tight direction and scripting, the film never dwells on simple generic plotting opting instead to allow the characters and events to unfold organically.

Winning best actor award at Austin Fantastic Fest and Directors to Watch award at the Palm Springs International Film Festival, *Spring* is an audacious combination of genres that explores the very nature of what it means to exist.

With its subtle yet warm human touch, the film in part recalls those rides taken in Jim Jarmusch's Night on Earth (1991), while others have compared it to Abbas Kiarostami's Taste Of Cherry (1997).

Winning audience acclaim and the Golden Bear at the 2015 Berlin International Film Festival, Tehran Taxi was described as "a love letter to cinema...filled with love for his art, his community, his country and his audience" by Berlin Jury President Darren Aronofsky. An exceptional movie and a perfect example of how much a true artist can create despite the odds.

Shot as a fake-fly-on-the-wall documentary about unlikely porn star Vixen Velvet as she makes her latest sex movie. Torn between her desire to be taken seriously as an actress, the porno film is rapidly hi-jacked by the star, who vows to turn the low budget sex film into a "cult" zombie movie. But then events take a real turn for the weird following an outbreak of a mysterious disease that threatens the small town and all its inhabitants.

Vixen Velvet's Zombie Massacre is almost the perfect case study in how to make low budget movies. Shot for next-tonothing, with the entire community rallying around to help Popescu complete the shoot. There's a wild and kinetic aesthetic at play and the entire movie is shot through with a kind of nervous jittery energy that takes the audience along for the ride.

Telling the story of the legendary stunt-motorcyclist through interviews with his peers, family and fans (including, of course, *Jackass'* Johnny Knoxville, also a producer of the film) *Being Evel* paints a fascinating, if not always flattering, picture of Evel Knievel, from his boyhood in Butte, Montana to his international fame. Punctuating these interviews is incredible footage from the era – not just of some genuinely awe inspiring stunts, but of the events that surrounded these spectacular displays of motorcycling skills.

In *Being Evel* director Daniel Junge turns in a great documentary, a celebration of the stunts, of the stuntman and of the era. More than this, the film understands the wider cultural influence of the stuntman and the world he helped create.

It's 1968 and in the USA William F. Buckley Jr. and Gore Vidal face off in a series of television debates at the Republican and Democrat Conventions. Both men were seen as intellectuals and opinion makers at the top of their game, one from the conservative right and one from the left. What followed was more than a clash of political ideas; rather it was a battle between two very different visions for the very future of the USA.

Told through a combination of archive footage – much of which is as powerful now as at the time – alongside talking heads interviews from the likes of Christopher Hitchens and Noam Chomsky, *Best of Enemies* is an utterly absorbing and exceptionally entertaining examination of two men, two minds, two political parties and two ideologies, and the clash between them. Many of the roots of contemporary politics and the modern media's presentation of political debate can be traced to these broadcasts and the cultural and public response to them.

Directed by Robert Gordon and Revelation favourite Morgan Neville (Twenty Feet from Stardom, The Cool School, Search and Destroy etc) Best of Enemies is essential viewing.

Plasmodial slime moulds wouldn't seem like the natural topic for a documentary, but under the careful direction of artist filmmaker Tim Grabham and writer/curator Jasper Sharp, these extraordinary organisms become truly fascinating. From searching the countryside for slime moulds to watching the way they grow and develop in laboratories *The Creeping Garden* examines slime mould and its impact on biological-inspired design, computing and even robotics.

There is almost a sense of science fiction at play in the film, as it explores the world of mycology. Meanwhile, a soundtrack by Jim O'Rourke (Sonic Youth, and scores for Harmony Korine, Werner Herzog and Koji Wakamatsu amongst others) underscores the uncanny nature of this strangely beautiful film.

'Imagine if Stanley Kubrick and Douglas Trumbull were tasked with making a 1970s educational science film about the pods from Don Siegel's Invasion of the Body Snatchers and you're some way to understanding The Creeping Garden.'

Best known for designing the Xenomorph, the planet and crashed spacecraft in the timeless science-fiction horror movie *Alien*, Giger's imagination terrified and inspired audiences across the globe and earned the Swiss artist an Oscar.

In HR Giger's visionary art appeared to mutate erupt and transform, demonic figures merged with people, genitals transformed into figures both erotic and monstrous, bloated baby-like creatures merged into landscapes. In his unsettling work all things seems to be fleshy, moist and endlessly alive, even if they are normally inanimate objects.

Giger's dark art drew deeply on surrealism, infusing his paintings with sex, horror, the uncanny, nightmares and again and again – transforming biomorphic bodies

Examining Giger's life and work, Dark Star: HR Giger's Welt (aka Dark Star: HR Giger's World) sees the artist in his studio and home, an almost perpetually darkened house in which he creates his work. Dressed in black, crowned with a mane of white hair, HR Giger cuts a unique figure as he talks about his art and life, the filmmakers taking the audience on a journey through Giger's visions and fears. Aided along the way by family, friends, critics, psychiatrists and artists, the film offers insights into his unique art – whether an album cover for Debbie Harry, a Giger-themed bar or his dark and mysterious cult book Necronomicon.

The film offers a fascinating exploration of Giger – who died only a short time before the movie was premiered – and it stands as a perfect eulogy to the Swiss surrealist who dedicated his life to sharing his nightmares.

David Thorpe thinks that he sounds 'gay.'

Having just split from his boyfriend, he is newly single, his confidence has taken a blow, and he is searching for answers. He turns the camera on himself and the community around him, asking the guestion: "do I sound gay?"

Shifting in tone throughout, Do I Sound Gay? moves from serious explorations of the notion of the 'gay voice' to humorous anecdotes. The 'gay voice' is often presented as a sign of homosexuality in the media, but in Thorpe's popular movie what emerges is more than merely an exploration of this 'gay voice' but also of the relationship between the 'gay voice' and identity, its relation to social affirmation and as a cultural signifier. Most importantly perhaps the film is ultimately about community and self-acceptance.

Director Thorpe peppers his own personal quest with interviews and insights from celebrities and icons such as Margaret Cho, Tim Gunn, Don Lemon, Dan Savage, David Sedaris and George Takei, all offering possible answers to the question Do I Sound Gay? Earning a People's Choice Award at Toronto 2014, and opening Doc NYC - the USA's largest documentary festival, Do I Sound Gay? has become something of a cult phenomena.

Described by Indiewire as "Incredibly thought-provoking and funny.... Should definitely be at the top of your 'to see' list," the film explores the taboo area with a wry wit.

Charlie Van Ness is a gay outsider artist. When we are introduced to him he is attaching penises to objects – creating phallic fibreglass handles for brooms and pans.

He has also made a penis pogo stick and other penis related sculptured objects. But as the film progresses it becomes clear that there is far more at work in Charlie's artistic practice and amongst other pieces Charlie has carved mythic tales onto hundreds of stone tablets. But then Charlie has a profound crisis, questioning the value of his work and the purpose of his life. Simultaneously, filmmaker Dave Bussan wonders if he has become too close to his subject.

The Gospel According to Charlie is an absorbing documentary that explores artistic ambition, individual obsessions and the demands of creativity, as well as the nature of sexuality, individuality and community. Shot over eight years, it follows Charlie's life and art through many changes and transformations, all guided by Bussan's pitch perfect observational narration.

Industrial music emerged simultaneously to punk, but eschewed the music of stripped down garage rock and roll for the wider possibilities of tape experiments, home-designed synths, tape loops, found object percussion, and radical experimentation.

Groups such as Throbbing Gristle, Cabaret Voltaire, Clock DVA, SPK, and Test Dept created their own music that traced an influence through the likes of Surrealism, Dada and Futurism, Krautrock bands such as Kraftwerk, writers such as JG Ballard and William Burroughs, and electronic film scores, amongst others things. *Industrial Soundtrack* explores all of this, and more, offering a cultural context for the music alongside interviews with musicians such as Stephen Mallinder, Genesis P-Orridge, Cosey Fanni Tutti and many others.

With an influence that extends to everything from techno music to movie themes, avant garde electronica to noise music, industrial music remains hugely influential.

Director Amélie Ravalec's previous credits include the cult documentary *Paris/Berlin: 20 Years of Underground Techno* while Travis Collins was a familiar figure in Perth's music community, working as a host on RTRfm's programs *Full Frequency* and *Morning Magazine*.

The Look of Silence sees director Joshua Oppenheimer return to Indonesia to continue his examination of the events that transpired in 1965. In many ways it forms a companion piece to the director's multi-award winning and Oscar nominated documentary *The Act of Killing* (Revelation 2013), however it is also a documentary work in its own right, and as a film it is far more traditional work than its predecessor.

The Look of Silence follows local optometrist Adi as he talks to people who were once involved in the killings, including the execution of his brother Ramli.

Through Adi's powerfully stoic onscreen appearance the film appears as a more directly personal work than *The Act of Killing*. Moreover Adi and his family live in the very communities where the killers live, giving the film an occasionally vertiginous perspective, as both subject and filmmakers uncover horrors from the almost casual comments dropped into conversation. The film maintains the raw power of its predecessor and makes for compulsive, essential viewing.

Winning numerous awards – including Grand Prize, FIPRESCI Prize, Human Rights Night Awards at Venice 2014, and Best World Documentary at Busan – *The Look of Silence* is a profound and troubling film that examines not just genocide but also the response of those who have been profoundly affected by it.

Those of you of early Rev vintage will fondly remember the Parkerville Amphitheatre regularly appearing in live performance and gig guides in Perth for many years. You'll also remember the four quarters of Perth music culture: City/Northbridge, Fremantle, Scarborough and the Hills. Each had their own feel and culture and each was a trek...but hey...maybe it's still the same!

Closing in 2001 (4 years after Rev's sticky carpet beginnings) but opening in 1971, the Parkerville Amphitheatre was the brainchild of artistic visionary John Joseph Jones who dedicated the space to providing a platform for alternative art, music and performance in Perth – and it rocked!

A haven for blues and boogie as well as providing the launch-pad for Perth theatre writers, directors and performers, the amphitheatre was a wholly unique but now all but forgotten phenomenon. Now overgrown and derelict this documentary brings this Perth icon back to life by exploring the personalities that inhabited this special place nestled in Perth's foothills.

With intimate interviews with Perth's theatre legends and those in the know, this simple film might be low-fi in nature but the message is resonant – especially for everyone ever involved in Rev or in the encouragement of alternative arts and opinions in WA.

For us there's a kindred spirit here – and a continuum. Come and be part of it.

A current film fest fave, *Tab Hunter Confidential* tells the story of the handsome heartthrob, actor and singer who became one of the most popular Hollywood male leads following *Battle Cry* (1955). With a career that has seen him play in roles opposite the likes of Natalie Wood, Sophia Loren, Debbie Reynolds and Divine (in John Water's *Polyester*), Tab Hunter also topped the charts with *Young Love* in 1957. But against the background of 1950s America Tab had one secret; he's gay.

You might be asking yourself "who is Tab Hunter?" (perhaps an alternate title of the film!) but whether you know of him or not it's the man's beautiful honesty that draws you into the world of 1950s Hollywood politics - sexual or otherwise. It's Tab himself - an ageing star who carries the show and for all lovers of cinema, it's a very lovely conversation about the strange duality of Hollywood, the star-making machine, the cult of celebrity and the power of the individual.

Multi -award winning director Jeffrey Schwarz, whose previous films include *I Am Divine* and *Spine Tingler! The William Castle Story*, both of which screened at Revelation, tells the story of Tab Hunter through interviews with the star, with John Waters, Clint Eastwood, Debbie Reynolds, and many others. As a director Schwarz has a genuine understanding of stardom and a pure appreciation for his material. His love of his subjects shines through in his work with an infectious enthusiasm that makes his movies a true joy to watch.

In The Visit director and artist Michael Madsen turns his attention to the possibility of aliens arriving on the Earth.

Best viewed as a speculative documentary, the film explores the notion of first contact through interviews with those who will be making the decisions should extraterrestrials arrive: the staff at UNOOSA (United Nations Office for Outer Space Affairs), scientists, SETI and NASA employees, military experts, social psychologists, and various specialists.

Describing the imaginary events, the interviewees explain how they would respond to the alien's arrival and, most intriguingly, what conversations they would initiate during first contact.

Shot with an ethereal, dreamlike quality, there is a sense of strange wonder to the images of the Earth, almost as if Madsen was seeing our planet for the first time. The style serves to emphasise the commentaries that come from the interviewees that move from the pragmatic response necessitated by first contact to such existential questions to ask the alien visitor as "what makes you happy?"

A unique film that re-imagines both the documentary and science fiction.

Yakona – which means rising water in the Tonkawan language - explores the San Marcos river as it flows through Texas, from Spring Lake towards the ocean. But more than flowing through geography the river that is the subject of the film also flows through time, and directors Paul Collins and Anlo Sepulveda imagine the history of the river, contrasting the past and modern relationships to the water. Simultaneously, the film looks under the surface, at the eco systems that exist in the clear waters.

Yakona achieves much of its power from its rich visuals, and it eschews narration in favour of allowing the audience to just watch the film, as it takes the audiences above and below the surface, forward and back in time, painting an absorbing portrait of the river.

Making the list of '10 Films That Stood Out' at the SXSW 2014 films in Variety, Yakona offers a beautiful, affecting examination of the river. Winning the audience award at SXSW 2014 and a best cinematography award at Rainier Independent Film Festival 2014, Yakona is a beautifully realised work.








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#### JACK'S PROGRAM HIGHWAY

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




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
